County Councillor's Report:

Cllr S Rushworth reported on the following issues:

- The barrier for Old Town Cove Car Park – Cllr Rushworth has spoken to Peter Marsh and it was agreed that a barrier that can be opened and closed rather than fixed would be the best option. Clerk to write to Peter Marsh to find out how much Cornwall Council can contribute to the barrier and fencing that would be required plus the installation. It would also be useful to obtain quotes at this stage as well. Clerk to action.

Highways

The area Highways steward, Chris James was able to meet up with the Chairman and visit the 2 sites in the parish where highways issues had been identified:

- Drainage at Trenance Hill – this issue of running water will be addressed.
- Trees on Dark Lane – he has agreed to get the 2 rotten/damaged oak trees taken down.

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Recreation Ground

A discussion took place regarding the possible purchase of the Recreation Ground, which the Parish Council currently leases from the Glebe. Cllr N Carhart proposed and Cllr E Ballard seconded to contact the Glebe through their agents, Savills, to ask again about the possibility of the Parish Council purchasing the Recreation Ground for use in perpetuity by the parishioners. Clerk to contact Savills and ask them to forward the correspondence to their client.

Cllr A Heard raised the issue of lighting on the Recreation Ground. Matt Ivins had very kindly fixed some of the lights which were out. Cllr C Ivins thought the issue for the remaining lights was that new bulbs were needed. He will find out and let us know at the next meeting.

Earmarked Reserves

It was agreed that the Councillors would take some time to think about what could benefit the Parish and then consider whether to allocate some of the general reserve to Parish Council projects. To be added to next times agenda
